

## MISSION

**Arts in California Parks** seeks to expand and deepen connections between individuals, communities, and natural landscapes throughout California by:

- Supporting artists, culture bearers, California Native American tribes, and communities in creating artwork that offers perspective on our past and present and helps us to reimagine our potential, and
- Establishing art installations and programming in State and local parks as catalysts for sustainable community connection, health and well-being.

Through this program, California's State and local parks will become more relevant and engaging to all, and will have greater capacity to nourish, educate and inspire individuals and communities.

## ADVISORY COMMITTEE

An Advisory Committee comprised of visual artists, musicians, performance artists, literary artists, and representatives from agencies and organizations that have experience implementing impactful art programs will guide the development and implementation of the Program.

**BUDGET:** \$25M one-time General Fund allocation

**SCHEDULE:** July 2022 - June 2027

**Funding categories may include, but are not limited to:**

- **Planning and Relationship Building**
- **Programs and Performance, Literary and Experiential Arts**
- **Installations** (ephemeral, temporary, permanent)
- **Artists in State Parks** (residencies, adventures, etc.)
