

## 2024 Arts in California Parks, Local Parks Grant Program Proposal Scoring Sheet for **Implementation Grants**

## **Minimum Qualifications**

- Completed applications must be submitted by a 501c3 non-profit organization, fiscally sponsored community organization, California Native American tribe, Native 7871 Organization, foundation, land trust and/or Local Government Agency (City, County, Regional).
- Projects must facilitate a partnership between nonprofit(s), artist(s) and local public park manager(s). Partnerships may include 501c3 non-profit organizations, fiscally sponsored community organizations, California Native American tribes, Native 7871 Organizations, foundations, land trusts and/or local governments.
- Projects must bring art and nature together as a catalyst for community connection in <u>local</u> <u>parks</u>.

Eligible projects must be open to the general public.

Relevancy     Artwork or cultural programming provides insights into the historical, contemporary, and/or future narratives of the local cultures and communities, ensuring regional appropriateness and relevance.	20
Community Engagement:  Inclusive community engagement strategies that enhance local cultural, historical, and social relevance such as artist selection, art programming, and outreach efforts.	15

Support for Artists and Creative Economy  • Supports regional creative economy through artist mentorship and career development opportunities.	15
Community Impact     Contributes to community connection, health, well-being, and placemaking.	15
Accessibility     Ensures inclusivity for all, including economic and physical accessibility.	15
Bonus Criteria for Enhanced Scoring	
<ul> <li>Preference will be given to proposals that:         <ul> <li>Provides participants with varied and/or multiple engagement opportunities to_experience.</li> <li>Integrate environmental sustainability practices and stewardship.</li> <li>Focus on preferred regions of the state that traditionally do not have access to these types of resources.</li> <li>Includes a matching grant component, demonstrating shared investment and partnership commitment.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	20
